Editorial

Census time comes around again. Yes, it's been 5 years since the last Census was done, doesn't seem that long ago to me.

So what is the Census? Here's some information from the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

The Census of Population and Housing aims to accurately count the number of people in Australia, their key characteristics, and the dwellings in which they live. During the Census every household and person in the country is required to answer specific questions on the paper form or through eCensus online.

When is the next Census? *The 16th Census of Population and Housing will take place on the night of 9 August 2011. The 2011 Census also marks a significant milestone – 100 years of national Census taking in Australia.*

Why should I be counted? *There are plenty of reasons why you should be counted in the Census. The Census is your chance to be heard, the information collected is used by decision makers, government and business to allocate services, facilities and funding in your community.*

The information collected at Census time lights the way forward for better planning of public transport, roads, shops, education, health care and housing – even festivals, events and skate parks can be planned using Census data.

It's simple, if you're not counted, you or your community could miss out on important services and facilities.

In the 2010-11 Federal Budget, funding of over \$4,000 per person was allocated to states and territories. This is calculated using population figures from the Census. Imagine if 1,000 people in your community didn't complete the Census, it

could be the difference between a five or thirty minute walk to the bus stop.

So after reading all that I took the time to look at some quick stats from the 2006 Census on the ABS website for the local (7268) postal area:

Population: There were 1087 people usually resident in our area, 50.3% male and 49.7% female (National averages were the opposite). 213 were under 15 years old, 149 were 15-24 years old, 453 were 25-54 years old, 272 were over 55 years old.

Marriage: Of those over 15, 507 were married (9% more than the Australian average, does this mean marriages are stronger in Lilydale?) 257 had never been married, 79 were separated or divorced and 39 were widowed.

Families: We had 322 families, 142 couples with kids, 128 couples without kids and 42 single parent families

Employment: For those over 15, 299 were employed full time, 163 part time, 25 unemployed and 318 not in the labour force. 96 were employed as Technicians and Trades Workers, 76 as Professionals, 67 as Managers, 65 in Clerical positions, 56 as Machine operators, 55 as Labourers, 43 as Sales people and 37 as Community and Personal Service workers.

Money: A very interesting point was the median household income of \$870 per week as opposed to the median Australian household income of \$1027 per week.

So it seems that whilst we are above average for our marriage rates we take home quite a bit less than our other state counterparts, (tell us something we didn't already know ;-). And who said statistics never tell the whole story.

So don't forget to fill our your Census forms on August the 9th.

To this end the purpose of the LDPA since it's beginning over 40 years ago has always been to encourage a membership that is open and inclusive.

Before centralisation of council Lilydale had it's own and when it was moved to Launceston the role of the LDPA was as it is now, to represent the local community. Our long time president Alderman Annette Waddle made good use of her position to keep Lilydale and the Launceston City Council in touch.

More recently the LDPA has been better supported by the community (most monthly meetings now have about 20+ present) including President Jeff Sims and eight other committee members.

The role of the group is simply outlined above but I'd like to take the opportunity to write a little about what's in it for members.

'Healthy Communities' is for some about healthy weight, responsible drinking, etc. I think it's about communities feeling good about themselves - that's just it.


Speaking for myself I feel good to be participating and working with other people even when their views differ (which is much more interesting) but who are prepared to listen to others point of view.

Some of the issues talked about at meetings over the years have been complex, in other words not fully knowable, but reasonably predictable - forestry is one example or car traffic. It has been difficult to work towards a consensus in Lilydale just as in the wider community.

Water is now often on the agenda. In my view this issue is more complicated than complex, like how a car works - not simple, but still knowable.

LDPA's communications so far with Ben Lomond Water have been a demonstration of how sometimes corporations and individuals are driven by self interest and don't listen to people.

I predict that Lilydale's water problems do still present an opportunity for it's residents to work together for something we can all understand and be proud of in the future. - John Gallagher Secretary LDPA.

Important Message from Northern Community Policing Services.

Design out Property Crime.

As a member of the community, there are steps you can take to protect yourself and your property from crime. People that take all necessary precautions are less likely to be targeted by thieves. Use the following information to reduce the likelihood of your property being targeted.

Whilst the majority of people are conscious of locking up their homes, a recent analysis of burglaries in the

Northern District has shown that some people are still not securing their garages, sheds and workshops adequately.

Recently thieves have been specifically targeting these areas. Common items stolen are tools and chainsaws. These items should not be left in the front or back yard or on display for any length of time. Many people are complacent when it comes to securing these areas. Sheds, Garages, Workshops should be locked at all times when not in use.

Stolen items of property are usually sold at a very cheap price. If the price of your new chainsaw is too good, then the chances are it is stolen. If you suspect this is the case, contact Launceston CIB for advice on 131 444. Did you know, that if you purchase items you suspect or know are stolen, then you may well be committing a crime yourself?

Lilydale Lantern Walk

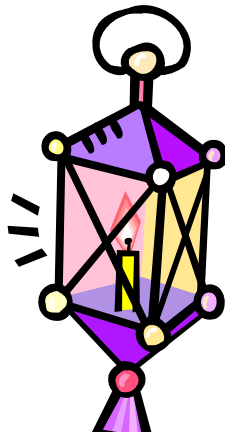

Irritable Bowel Syndrome. (IBS)

This is a very common gastro-intestinal disorder resulting in abdominal pain and changes in bowel habits. The cause is unknown but it seems to be related to a sensitive, easily upset digestive system.

Symptoms vary widely from person to person but include;

- Abdominal pain or cramp, often relieved by passing wind.
- Diarrhoea or constipation, or one then the other.
- Feeling full or bloated.
- Excess wind
- Heartburn or indigestion
- Nausea or loss of appetite.

Most people have mild symptoms that come and go, but sometimes they can be so severe as to interfere with daily activities. Although IBS is distressing, it does not cause damage or lead to other bowel diseases.

There are a variety of triggers that can aggravate IBS. These include:

- Stress, including strong emotions like anxiety, anger or fear;
- Eating can make the symptoms worse, or just some types of food (alcohol, caffeine, sweeteners, fatty food, dairy)
- Gut infections – however there is no evidence that candida (thrush) makes IBS worse.
- Some medicines. Eg codeine and iron makes constipation worse.

The symptoms of IBS can also be symptoms of other bowel diseases – so if you think you have IBS you should consult your doctor, and go through all the tests for the other bowel diseases. When the other diseases have been excluded, then you have IBS – but at least it's not going to harm you.

There is no cure for IBS, so it's about managing your symptoms and learning how to live with it.

Try to identify all your triggers by keeping records of your symptoms and what you do, eat, drink, emotions and medicines.

- Reduce caffeine (tea, coffee, cola),
- reduce alcohol,
- reduce foods high in fat, sugar or salt.
- Try slowly increasing the amount of fibre in your diet, as this often helps constipation.
- Drink more water (up to 8 glasses a day)
- Don't smoke
- Learn and practice relaxation techniques to manage stress – eg yoga, tai-chi
- Exercise moderately – about 30 minutes a day.

Some medicines can be helpful. Anti-spasm medicines can reduce intestinal activity, cramp and diarrhoea. E.g. peppermint oil, Buscopan and Donnatab.

Anti-diarrhoea medicines like Lomotil, Imodium and Gastro-stop.

Probiotics like Inner Health sometimes help diarrhoea.

Regular fibre supplements and occasional laxatives can help with constipation.

I even looked at an artwork from 1501 held in the National Library of France, but freely available to view online.

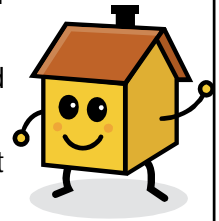

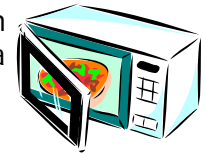

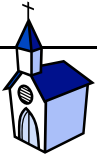
