Letter to LDPA form Alderman Jeremy Ball regarding Ben Lomond Water.

The concerns of Lilydale residents re the lack of meaningful community consultation around the prospect of a Ben Lomond Water (BLW) pipeline being constructed to provide piped water to the area led me some months ago to move a motion at Council to invite the Chair of BLW (and all three water corporations) Miles Hampton to publicly respond to this and other concerns.

Miles Hampton along with CEO Barry Cash duly attended the last LCC meeting on Monday September 12th at 1pm.

I invited Lilydale residents who were concerned about the issue either to email questions to me/council or attend the meeting and ask questions directly of Mr Hampton.

I was a little surprised that none were forthcoming however knowing that people were very busy and also more than a little frustrated about the process I made it my business at the meeting to ask questions of Mr Hampton about the Lilydale issues.

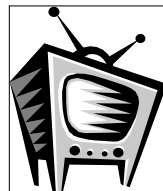

- Why was a pipeline being proposed for construction when at least half of the residents don't want or need it?
- Had other methods for the provision of water been explored?
- What was the cost?

I was told by Barry Cash that the Deputy Director of Public Health had said that Lilydale's water was the worst in Tasmania (you can check the online audio of the meeting at www.launceston.tas.gov.au <<http://www.launceston.tas.gov.au>> and go to meeting minutes which are now available as an audio file (another motion of mine actually...) so a pipeline needed to be built to provide water of an acceptable standard.

Other methods of providing water are always looked at according to Miles Hampton and BLW go with the best available option.

The cost of the pipeline is estimated at \$7 million (no doubt this will go up...)

From here I would suggest that Lilydale residents open up a conversation with the Director of public health and get his reasons for the assessment by the Health department.

I am totally committed to making sure that residents' concerns are heard and respected and will continue to fight on your behalf.

Letter from State Manager Department of Health

Dear John

Thank you for your email dated 16 September 2011 seeking our views on Ben Lomond Water's proposal to provide treated drinking water to Lilydale.

While our department is not required to consult directly with a community on how potable water is supplied to towns by their respective water corporations, we would certainly encourage the water corporation to do so.

The Department's Deputy Director of Public Health and the State Water Officer also attended the public meeting in Lilydale on 4 November 2010, and participated in the discussion (including a short presentation by the Deputy DPH).

One of the key points that DHHS made that evening was that Lilydale had the "Worst quality drinking water in the State (even amongst the untreated supply systems operating with permanent boil water alerts)". This statement was based on the fact that every sample ever taken of the town water failed to meet the microbiological standard.

So on that basis and the inherent public health risk associated with such poor water, DHHS is supportive of **Ben Lomond Water's proposal to bring potable water to Lilydale.** However I will ensure that your **concerns over BLW's consultation are drawn to their attention.**

Thanks again for bringing this to our notice.

More Important Information

From 30 November 2010, children aged four years to less than the age of seven must be restrained in either an approved forward facing child restraint with an inbuilt harness or an approved booster seat restrained by a correctly adjusted and fastened seatbelt.

In addition to this, there are current laws about where children can sit in vehicles.

Children aged 4 – 7 years should not be in the front seat of a vehicle, unless the other passengers in the back are under 7 also. Children under four years must only travel in the back seat of a sedan and all children must wear an age appropriate device.

Guide to selecting a child restraint

Age	Indicative weight	Child restraint
0 to 6 months	less than 8 kilograms (kgs)	Rearward facing baby capsule or infant restraint
6 months to 1 year	8 to 12 kgs	Rearward or forward facing infant restraint
6 months to 4 years	8 to 18 kgs	Forward facing child restraint with built-in harness
4 years to 7 years	14 to 26 kgs	Booster seat with H-harness or a booster seat with a secured adult seatbelt

The penalty for failing to ensure a child aged under 16 years wears a child restraint or seat belt as required, is 3 demerit points and a \$350 fine. A driver who fails to ensure a passenger 16 years and over is restrained also incurs a fine of \$300 and 3 demerit points.

Mental Health First Aid.

With the increasing acceptance that mental health is a real and important part of our overall health and well-being, first aid courses and guidelines for mental health have been developed. (Check the internet) The following information is taken from www.mhfa.com.au This website discusses first aid for most areas of mental health; including traumatised children, alcohol abuse, eating disorders and psychosis.

Signs that a person may be suicidal:

- Threatening to hurt or kill themselves.
- Looking for ways to kill themselves: (seeking access to pills, weapons, or other means).
- Talking or writing about death, dying or suicide.
- Hopelessness.
- Rage, anger, seeking revenge.
- Acting recklessly or engaging in risky activities, seemingly without thinking.
- **Feeling trapped, like there's no way out.**
- Increasing alcohol or drug use.
- Withdrawing from friends, family or society.
- Anxiety, agitation, unable to sleep or sleeping all the time.
- Dramatic changes in mood.
- No reason for living, no sense of purpose in life.

If you suspect someone may be at risk of suicide, it is important to ask them directly about suicidal thoughts.

Do not avoid using the word 'suicide'. It is important to ask the question without dread, and without expressing a negative judgement. The question must be direct and to the point. For example, you could ask:

- **"Are you having thoughts of suicide?"** or
- **"Are you thinking about killing yourself?"**

If you appear confident in the face of the suicide crisis, this can be reassuring for the suicidal person.

Although some people think that talking about suicide **can put the idea in the person's mind, this is not true.** Another myth is that someone who talks about suicide **isn't really serious. Talking about suicide may be a way for the person to indicate just how badly they are feeling.**

A person who is actively suicidal should not be left on **their own. If you can't stay with them, you need to arrange for someone else to do so.** In addition, give the person a safety contact which is available at all times (a telephone help line - e.g. lifeline, a friend or family member who has agreed to help, or a professional help giver).

Suicidal thoughts are often a plea for help and a desperate attempt to escape from problems and distressing feelings. You should encourage the suicidal person to do most of the talking, if they are able to.

They need the opportunity to talk about their feelings and their reasons for wanting to die and may feel great relief at being able to do this.

It may be helpful to talk about some of the specific problems the person is experiencing. Discuss ways to **deal with problems, but do not attempt to 'solve' the problems yourself.**

Rhododendron Gardens

We are happy to report that the dispute over access to the Rhododendron Gardens (formerly known as WAG Walker Rhododendron Reserve) is resolved, and we would like to open the gardens to the local community this year from late October.

We purchased the property four years ago and began restoring the gardens. The task was far bigger than we had imagined!

The main garden area below the car parks required extensive weeding. Many of the rhododendron beds had been grown right through with tree weeds (holly, wattle, cotoneaster) and blackberries. It took over a year to clear the large weeds and remove the dead vegetation. Work in the rhododendrons themselves has been ongoing, but we have also undertaken major works renovating the toilets, the dam, upgrading the vehicle track inside the garden area, and removal of a large area of poplar suckers which were threatening significant trees. We have also begun a program of planting in this section of the gardens, to hopefully offset the decline of many of the beautiful older trees.

It is this part of the property that was known by the **public as the "rhododendron reserve" in its former life** with the Parks and Wildlife service, and it is this part that we intend to re-open for public enjoyment this year.

Please feel free to come and enjoy the rhododendrons in bloom this spring. We will open the gates from 10am to 4pm on weekends from the Saturday 29th October to Sunday 20th November (other times by private arrangement). The gardens will be closed the

following weekend due to a private function. Please pay attention to the signage.

Entry to the gardens this year is by donation to help cover the costs of public liability insurance.

If anyone would like to help us man the gardens over these weekends, we would be really grateful.

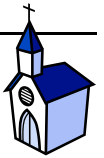
