Letter to the Editor

As a former parent and as a current and long serving teacher at Lilydale District School, and having lived in the community for over 25 years, I feel it overdue that I write about my disappointment at the ongoing vandalism that occurs each week around the school property.

Each week we are confronted with damage caused by a **few senseless individuals who think it is 'fun' to wreck** school property and leave cans and broken bottles around the grounds for someone else to clean up. When out and about on duty, I notice the broken bricks that can only have been forcibly thrown from the oval seating wall, broken security lighting, picnic tables dismantled, seats that have been bent, (and we are referring to excellent public quality seating) and most recently, the shade sail outside the canteen has been damaged again. It cost over \$10 000 last time it was damaged... who knows how much this time?

Where does the money come from to carry out the repairs and replacements? From the learning programs of course! As a staff member and in support of the P and F, we all work very hard fundraising to provide opportunities for the school community but I am increasingly disillusioned.

Please keep your eyes open and report it to the school or local police if you see things going on out of hours that seem inappropriate.

Step up! It's our school and our communities' reputation here.

Pain

Pain is a common problem that we all suffer from occasionally. Nevertheless, pain is often neglected and poorly managed. Pain is there for a reason – an injury, illness or disease.

As we get older pain is more likely to become part of our everyday life. Musculo-skeletal pain (pain affecting the muscles and the bones) is ranked seventh in respect of the burden of illness and disease in the community. Pain is also a component of conditions such as cancer, heart disease and injuries.

The cause of some pain is easy to identify - sports injuries, toothache and period pain for instance - and this makes the choice of treatments somewhat easier. Pain may also be a sign of another underlying disease that needs to be treated.

Pain relieving medicines are not always the first line treatment; and even when they are, their effect can be improved by other measures such as hot/cold packs, physiotherapy, massage, TENS machines and acupuncture.

The selection of the most appropriate pain reliever will depend on a number of factors - the type of pain to be treated, the severity and duration of the pain and whether the person needing the pain reliever has any other medical conditions or is taking any other medicines.

Many potent pain relievers are now available without prescription; so self-medication has become an easy option. Even so, it is important to make sure the pain reliever you choose is likely to give you the most benefit with the least risk.

It is generally accepted that for chronic (that is long lasting) pain such as arthritis, the first choice therapy is paracetamol (e.g. Panamax, Panadol Osteo) - especially in older people or those people taking medicines for high blood pressure. The amount that you take is **significant, because most people don't take the right amount.** Up to 8 tablets each day of Panamax, or 6 tablets each day of Panadol Osteo, is usually necessary to achieve pain relief. More than this is too much, but **most people don't take enough. Paracetamol is often found in cold and flu tablets, so be aware of this.** The maximum adult dose of paracetamol is 4000mg per day.

The products known as non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs e.g. Voltaren, Fenac, Oruvail, Nurofen, Disprin, Celebrex) may be more suitable for some forms of pain where inflammation is a feature, such as back pain, period pain and rheumatoid arthritis. However, some people are better to avoid NSAIDs. NSAIDs can worsen indigestion, asthma, fluid retention, high blood pressure and heart conditions.

Codeine is available in combination with paracetamol or NSAIDs, and can give added pain relief. However, codeine can cause constipation, dizziness, drowsiness or nausea.

Fish Oil can be used to help reduce inflammation and improve joint mobility in osteoarthritis, and up to 12 capsules a day may need to be taken.

Ask us at the Pharmacy – we can advise you on the most appropriate therapy for your type of pain, and also provide information and helpful hints on how to manage or prevent those pains.

Lilydale Fire Brigade

Recruiting & Membership Information:-

As you know, Lilydale Fire Brigade is a VOLUNTEER Fire Brigade. At present we are surviving with 10 Active Fire Fighters. This number is obviously a very small percentage of the community. While our members are very well trained there are simply not enough of us to provide the appropriate level of protection Lilydale Community deserves.

HOW CAN YOU HELP? The Brigade has a variety of membership options available to suit most peoples availability.

Active Membership:- Active members are trained to Australian standards to participate in a range of Fire Fighting activities from basic vegetation/bush fire fighting up to structural fire fighting employing breathing apparatus. Vegetation Fire Fighters can be trained to suitable requirements within 3 months so you have time to assist this year. Structural Fire Fighting takes approx 12 to 18 month.

Non Active Membership:- Non Active Members are members who provide support roles to the brigade without participating in Fire Fighting. Activities such as Social Club, Admin, Maintenance, all have existing members who also need extra hands. Non Active members are an essential part of the brigade & are as important as Fire Fighters.

Cadet Membership:- Open to boys & girls aged between 15 & 17 yrs old.

TRAINING:- All members receive Nationally Recognised Training from Fire Fighting to First Aid.

Initial Training is conducted on station which permits vegetation fire attendance. Further training is conducted at Fire Service Northern Regional HQ at Youngtown.

We attend Brigade Training approx twice a month at Lilydale Station (more in summer less in winter). The State Fire Service Act states we **MUST** attend training a minimum of once per month.

2011 Summer Fire Season

This year may or may not be a serious fire threat to our community. Considering the weather of the past

12 to 18 months we have a huge build up of fuel in our surrounding forests, farms & homes. NOW is the time to start considering your fire hazard reduction plans. Lilydale Brigade members are available to assist with advice & planning. We may also be able to assist with hazard reduction burning depending on weather & availability of members. From September forward we should be beginning hazard reduction burning prior to the arrival of permit periods. If you require advice or assistance please contact us on the numbers below.

Out Reach

Many members of our community may require our assistance with home fire safety auditing & advice.

If you have concerns regarding your home fire safety, smoke detector installation & battery changes, evacuation planning or supply of fire fighting equipment we may be worth a call. This service is intended for those among us that may be unable to attend to the above needs due to health, age or disability. Please feel free to call us.

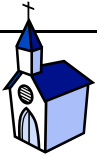
